The 2022 City Budget will come to City Council for adoption in December.

The City's Downtown Master Plan, Downtown Idaho Springs IS...will be considered for adoption later this year.

The City is working on a downtown parking structure and mobility hub in partnership with CDOT and Downtown Property Owners.

Public Works Director John Bordoni

Property Owners are responsible for removing snow from the sidewalks adjacent to their buildings within 24 hours of 2" of snowfall. Property Owners are also responsible to ensure that sidewalks are generally passable and safe.

ADA Ramp Work is underway around Carlson Elementary. The Crosswalk on Miner Street between Carlson and the South Side of Miner Street will also be moved. There will be at least 1 lane open during construction; the project is anticipated to last about a week.
